RESEARCH GUIDELINES

The campaign is a research based project, where all delegates who have opted for the campaign need to prepare research papers. The delegates will be taken to Peeh village to interact with people in different locations of Peeh. The locations would be allotted to your respective school via email. Every delegate needs to have a basic idea about the background of the location they will visit. We are giving some guidelines to assist the delegates in their research. Delegates should take note of the basic schemes and policies of the government and review the effectiveness of each. The delegates must collect information on the day to day problems faced by the villagers, and interview them on various different aspects of their lives. The delegates are expected to prepare a question-bank in advance based on the guidelines; however a new angle will be appreciated and a unique research paper will be applauded. In fieldwork being conducted, we would like to encourage sensitivity across the board. We would encourage a lens of appreciative enquiry – an inquisitiveness to genuinely know more than presumptuous questions over everyday practices of the rural community. Any instance of misconduct will lead to immediate disqualification.

FORMAT OF THE RESEARCH PAPER

We would like you to submit a research paper by the morning of 23rd April, which we shall compile and send to the relevant bodies for further plan of action. The following are the guidelines for the same.

- 1. The research papers should constitute the following structure
 - Introduction to your Theme, Context and Scheme (100 150 Words)
 - Review of Academic Literature with Citations/References/Bibliography at the end (300 350 Words)
 - Field Observations with Examples, Insights, Challenges and Learning (600 700 Words)
 - Recommendations with Examples of Best Practices in Other Regions (200 300 Words)
- 2. Maximum word limit for the research paper is 1500 words.
- 3. All research papers will be checked for plagiarism.
- 4. Ideally, the first two sections of the research paper must be prepared earlier in order to save time.
